POISONOUS MANURES.

A proclamation has been issued, prohibiting the importation of mamire containing calcium cyanide or any similar poisonous substance, or arsenic, or any other irritant poison, in proportion sufficient to render manure poisonous if inhaled, or if deposited on the mucous membrane of the skin of a man, unless it appropriately packed and labelled.
