Corps in 1942 becoming a B-17 navigator as part of the 8th Air Force, 379th Bomb Group stationed in England. His plane, the Ronny Boy, was shot down on Aug. 24, 1944, south of Berlin, Germany. He was sent to Stalag Luft III and ended up in Stalag 7A, Moosburg, Germany, until he was liberated by Patton's Army in April, 1945.

Ewan married Marion Moe on June 2, 1946, and

they lived in New Hyde Park, where he managed the Grand Union. He moved his family to Throop, in 1954, and

he managed the Auburn Market Basket. He then went to work for Acme Markets as a manager and supervisor for many years in the Upstate New York region. He retired from the grocery business in the mid 1980s, working and volunteering part time at the Auburn YMCA until 2002, when he developed Parkinson's disease.
